The Women of Grace Sustainable Sewing initiative moved forward joyfully this summer with the Panti Project. It could not have been more successful!!! 21 widows worked as a team at the Mbowe Community Center, learning to make reusable feminine hygiene kits, Some widows prepared fabric, some traced and cut pattern pieces, and some sewed on machines. By the end of the 2 week training, the team was making high quality washable flannel pads, cotton panties, and 'Panti Purses', to keep the items in. The widows are now sewing the items independently and earning a small stipend for each item produced.

Sam Chirwa, the WOG field manager, tells us that the women are thrilled to be earning a reliable income to help support their families. The first 25 'Panti Packs' were distributed to local teenage girls at Mbowe to allow them to attend school throughout their menstrual cycle. Margot McGorman and Karen Ivings the 2 trainers, feel very blessed and privileged to have participated in such a wonderful undertaking. Have you supported our new well project yet? Marion Medical Mission builds wells in remote corners of Malawi, Zambia, and Tanzania. They hope to install 2800 wells over roughly 57,000 square miles before end of 2017. These wells will offer clean water to 400,000 people for the first time in their lives. American teams of volunteers go to Africa and complete the work. As each well is completed, the volunteers ensure that each village knows that their well is special because it is God's love that is shared with them. In the past few weeks, I have received a number of requests for assistance from the MINC Emergency Fund. Requests range from assistance with preventing electrical and /or gas shut off and purchase of heating oil. HEAP will not be available until the middle of November, so some folks are in need now. Some of these folks are having difficulty because of recent changes in their lives and most of these have children or people who are ill in the home.

One women I know personally has six children living with her. Her husband left her a couple of months ago. She and her children are living in the home, but the husband refuses to buy oil to heat it. Last night a friend bought 10 gallons of kero for them. The cost is over \$3 per gallon. Another friend bled the furnace and they were warm last night. But 10 gallons will last only a couple of days. I have suggested that she contact Social Services and the Urban Mission to see what they can do to help. BUT the bottom line is this, it is getting colder and at this point the Emergency Fund is empty. If you are planning to make a donation to the fund this year and are able to do some now, it would be greatly appreciated.

Upon recommendation of the Finance Committee and approval by the Session, this year's Bi-Centennial Legacy Fund is being given to the Watertown New Worshipping Community. The grant of \$4,000 is most fitting this year, as the BCL Fund (created in 1997) was established to assist newly forming congregations and to re-vitalize existing congregations. This NWC- one of many emerging across the Presbyterian Church in the USA- began to take shape earlier this year, with a supporting Presbytery committee formed in June, and a \$3,000 grant approved by Presbytery for initial funding needs. Under the leadership of the Rev. Sarah Lee, the Watertown NWC seeks to build a new congregation centered in young adults and those of mixed cultural/racial backgrounds, especially relevant given the large presence in the area of Ft. Drum.

Youth Trip to the UN on February Tuesday 20-Thursday 22, 2018.

The New York State Council of Churches will sponsor a trip for senior high youth to the United Nations.

The focus of our time together will be: "Reclaiming the Voice of Resistance."
WE will study at the Church of the Covenant, near the Hilton Hotel where we are staying, and tour the UN. The seminar is designed to equip youth to be advocates for change. The cost is \$400 which covers lodging, travel by chartered bus, 2 lunches and two breakfasts. Students will need to bring money for dinner Monday and Tuesday (unless they opt to join the group for a Broadway show and dinner in times Square on tuesday) which will be an additional charge.
